

## Learning Some Tricky Verbs Ending in "-ify"

**Directions:** The suffix *-ify* means "to make" and you will commonly find it forming the ending of transitive verbs (e.g., *purify*: to make pure; *solidify*: to make solid). Look the following *-ify* verbs up in the Visual Thesaurus, learn their definitions, and then write an original sentence for each verb by using the sentence frames below as your guide. See the example sentence below, written for the transitive verb *ratify*.

ratify: (transitive verb)
